# **RECOMMENDATION**

That Council endorse the recommendation of the Regional Arts Development Fund Advisory Committee to award \$5,000 to Port Douglas Artists Inc.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Council has received an application for funding under stage one (1) of the Regional Arts Development Fund (RADF) grant program from Port Douglas Artists Inc.

The RADF Advisory Committee met on 24 June 2025 to assess the application and have recommended that the project be funded.

This report is to endorse the decision of the committee.

### **BACKGROUND**

The Regional Arts Development Fund (RADF) is a partnership between Arts Queensland and Council, aimed at supporting the development of arts and culture across the State.

RADF provides funding for projects that engage communities in creative activities, build capacity for local artists, and enhance cultural vibrancy. The program is a key driver in strengthening community connections through arts initiatives and promoting creative opportunities within the Douglas Shire.

#### **COMMENTS**

Applications are required to articulate delivery against the RADF objectives and assessment criteria including quality, reach, impact, and viability within the local context, describing alignment to the identified arts and cultural priorities of Council.

The RADF Advisory Committee met on the 24 June 2025 to review an application from Port Douglas Artists Inc. The application named Call of the Running Tide; The Littoral Zone – Stage One, proposes to develop artistic responses from five (5) local artists and produce a short video documenting the artists and their approach to site specific art.

The RADF Advisory Committee recommended funding the project.

# **PROPOSAL**

That Council endorse the recommendation of the Regional Arts Development Fund Advisory Committee to award \$5,000 to Port Douglas Artists Inc.

#### FINANCIAL/RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS

The costs associated with Council's RADF program are allocated in the budget for the 2025-2026 financial year.

#### **RISK MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS**

There is some risk of the failure to acquit the funds. Risk management procedures in relation to outstanding RADF outcome reports are in place. At times grantees may face circumstances beyond their control which impact on project timelines. Council officers support artists and organisations in such situations to achieve the original outcomes of awarded projects.
