

Road Conditions – 31 May 2024.

Cape Tribulation Road

The road from the Daintree Ferry to just past Cape Trib Beach House is open to all vehicles. There are weight, time and length restrictions.

Alexandra Range – Open 5am to Midnight.

- If towing a trailer, caravan or campervan, total length cannot exceed 15.1 metres.
- Rigid vehicles cannot exceed 12.5 metres in length.
- Maximum weight 25 tonne.

Noah Creek Bridge

- Open to all vehicles 16 tonnes or under. Vehicles above 16 tonnes must use the causeway upstream.

Noah Range – Open 5am to midnight.

- No weight or length restrictions.

Pavement Repairs

- Sections of damaged pavements on Turpentine Road and Cape Tribulation Road will be repaired over the next two weeks.

Cape Tribulation Bloomfield Road

- Currently Closed
- Repairs are on track for the road to be opened to 4WD vehicles 22 June 2024.
- The road is unsuitable for caravans or campervans.

China Camp Road

- 4WD vehicles have access to China Camp but there is a 5 tonne weight limit.
- The road is still very wet, but contractors have been able to get material down in large sections of the road to Keatings Crossing which will be shaped up by the grader when the sun comes out.
- Work on Ten Mile and the southern end of Zig Zag is being hampered by logistical issues. We are working everyday to resolve these issues.

CREB – Closed

- An inspection yesterday found the Daintree River was still too high for vehicles to cross.
- Until the water level drops, vehicles cannot inspect the southern end of the track, or commence any repairs.

Noah Range

There is now sufficient confidence in the readings from the radar monitoring to safely extend the opening hours for Noah Range to match that of Alexandra Range and the Daintree Ferry.

The extended hours will be effective as from tonight, Friday 31 May 2024.

Damaged Sections of Unsealed Roads

- Douglas Shire Council released two tenders this week to repair sections of unsealed roads which were damaged.
- One package covers damaged areas of gravel roads south of the Daintree River.
- The second package covers damaged areas of gravel road between the Daintree River and Cape Tribulation.
- The tenders were released 22 May 2024 and will close 12 June 2024.
- Council is working to award both contracts by 30 June.
- The value of the tenders is \$11.4 million and the repairs will be funded under the Commonwealth and State Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements.
- The repairs come under the Recovery of Essential Public Assets (REPA) program administered by Queensland Recovery Authority.
