

5.4. 2023 AUSTRALIA DAY AWARDS

RECOMMENDATION

That Council:

1. That Council endorses the Australia Day Awards recipients as decided by the Australia Day panel in line with the Douglas Shire Australia Day Award Guidelines.
2. Delegates authority under s 257 of the *Local Government Act 2009 (Qld)* to the Chief Executive Officer to finalise any amendments in relation to administering the Australia Day Awards Ceremony for 2023.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

An integral part of Australia Day celebrations are local Australia Day awards held throughout the country, recognising outstanding achievement and excellence in our communities.

Douglas Shire Council's Australia Day Award Ceremony will be held on Thursday 26 January 2023, commencing after the Citizenship ceremony at the Port Douglas Community Hall.

BACKGROUND

Douglas Shire Council's Australia Day Award categories are:

Citizen of the Year recognising outstanding members of the community for their personal endeavours, achievements, and community involvement.

Senior Citizen of the Year (over 65 years of age as of 26 January 2023) recognising senior citizens for their personal endeavours, achievements, and community involvement, or outstanding service to the local community.

Young Citizen of the Year (Aged 25 years or under at 26 January 2023) recognising young citizens for their personal endeavours, achievements and community involvement.

Volunteer of the Year recognising members of the community of any age making significant and lasting contributions to the social, recreational, environmental and economic quality of life in the community through their endeavours on behalf of individuals, organisations, charities, service groups, clubs, churches, sporting groups, health or youth.

Arts and Cultural Award recognises community members of any age, making significant and lasting contributions to arts and culture.

Environmental Achievement Award recognises members of the community of any age making significant and lasting contributions to the environment.

Senior Sports Award recognises sports people for their personal endeavours and achievements in their sporting code.

Junior Sports Award (Aged 18 years or under at 26 January 2023) recognises young sports people for their personal endeavours and achievements in their sporting code.

To be eligible to be nominated for a Douglas Shire Council Australia Day Award, nominees must be;

- An Australian citizen
- Resident of the Douglas Shire Council local government area
- Has not been a previous recipient of an Australia Day Award in the same category,
- Is not an elected representative e.g. MP, Councilor or a recipient of Australia and Imperial Honours.

Australia Day Award nominations opened on 14 September 2022 and closed at 4.30pm on Friday 18 November 2022 (extended till Friday 25 November 2022) and were promoted via:

- Article in Your Douglas News (Cairns Local News – 14 October 2022)
- Ad in Your Douglas News (Cairns Local News – 11 November 2022)
- Included multiple times in Council's fortnightly E-Newsletter
- Online form received 109 unique page views.

- Promoted via Minute with the Mayor on 4 October 2022
- Councillors video calling for nominations
 - o 21-day campaign (October 2022)
 - o Reached 9952 people and resulted in 40,074 post impressions.
 - o 448 clicks to the online nomination form
- 'Nominate a local legend today' social media tile
 - o \$210 spend
 - o 10-day campaign (November 2022)
 - o Reached 3517 people and
 - o 120 clicks to the online nomination form

The Australia Day Awards will be held at Port Douglas Community Hall on Thursday 26 January 2023 in conjunction with a Citizenship Ceremony.

Each eligible award nominee will be acknowledged and presented with a nomination certificate and a gift from the council nursery, at the ceremony.

Each award recipient will be presented with a framed certificate and engraved medallion.

COMMENTS

All nominees have been contacted to confirm their acceptance of their nomination before proceeding with assessment of the nominations.

In addition to confirming acceptance, eligibility was checked with each nominee, and their parent / guardian, for nominees under 18 years of age.

To avoid the risk of printing certificates and engraving medallions for recipients not wanting to accept their nomination or award, the nomination form stipulated all nominees will be contacted in the first instance to confirm acceptance of their nomination before proceeding with assessment of the nominations.

The risk of not approving this recommendation would mean that the Australia Day Awards are not able to be presented at the celebrations.
