EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Council is required to adopt and publicly notify the date, time and place of its Ordinary Council Meetings for the months of January, February and March 2024.

BACKGROUND

Council is required on an annual basis to publish on the website notice of the days and times when its Ordinary Council Meetings will be held. Section 257(1) of the *Local Government Regulation 2012* states that Council must meet at least once in each month.

Ordinary Council Meetings are usually held on the last Tuesday of every month commencing at 10:00am, unless otherwise stated.

Electoral Commission Queensland have indicated that the election notice will be issued on 29 January 2024 in advance of the 16 March 2024 quadrennial Local Government Elections.

COMMENTS

If the meetings are held on the last Tuesday of each month, Ordinary Council Meetings in January and February 2024 will fall within the period that Council has entered the Caretaker period in the lead up to the election. Further, a meeting in the last week of March 2024 would occur beyond the election.

It is suggested that the January meeting be conducted in the week prior to the caretaker period commencing, on Tuesday 23 January 2024. The February meeting could occur on the last Tuesday in February, on 27 February 2024.

As Council is required to hold a meeting once every month, it is suggested the March meeting be held on 12 March 2024, with a shortened agenda to accept the minutes of the February meeting.

The meetings in February and March 2024 will be conducted in accordance with Council's Caretaker Period policy.

Following the election on 16 March 2024, the new Council will determine meeting dates for the remainder of 2024 in accordance with s 256 of the Regulation.
