6.14. GROWING REGIONS GRANT EXPRESSION OF INTEREST SUCCESS

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DEPARTMENT Infrastructure

RECOMMENDATION

That Council resolves to Commit \$750,000.00 (GST-exclusive) in the 2024-2025 Capital Works Program as Council's co-contribution to the Growing Regions Program – Round 2 (Adventure Playground application).

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Council recognises the importance of providing recreational opportunities for both residents and tourists. By committing \$750,000.00 as a co-contribution to the Growing Regions Program (GRP), Council is assisting and promoting the importance of physical activity, social interaction, and tourism to the region. The success of these three areas, greatly assists the economic growth in Port Douglas and the wider Douglas Shire area.

The \$750,000.00 commitment from Council, as a 50% co-contribution, is required to enable Council to submit an application to the Growing Regions Program – round 2 for the Adventure Playground.

Stage 2 of GRP opens Monday 27 November 2023 and closes on Monday 15 January 2024. Council is likely to find out if the application is successful around mid to late March.

BACKGROUND

Douglas Shire Council applied to the Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development, Communications and the Arts under the Growing Regions Program Round 1 as an Expression of Interest, which closed on the 1 August 2023 for a \$750,000 Grant for an Adventure Playground.

Council was notified on the 24 November 2023 that they had been successful with the Expression of Interest and can proceed to stage 2.

COMMENTS

Council has been invited by the Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development, Communications and the Arts under the Growing Regions Program Round 2, to apply for \$750,000.00 grant as part of an equal contribution to the cost of constructing a new playground in Port Douglas. As Council has resolved to build a new playground at Rex Smeal Park (Special Meeting on 21 November 2023), Council staff have been advised by the funding body to proceed with the application at a new location for the Adventure Playground in Port Douglas.

Since the previous budget for the initial Expression of Interest to the GRP has been repurposed to an alternative new playground in Rex Smeal Park, a new budget commitment is required for the 2024-2025 financial year to progress the application to round 2.

If the \$750,000.00 is not committed for the application, then the application cannot progress.

PROPOSAL

The Council resolves to commit \$750,000 (GST exclusive) to the 2024-2025 Capital Works Program as Council's co-contribution to the Growing Regions Program – round 2 submission for the Adventure Playground application.

FINANCIAL/RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS

The \$750,000.00 is required to be allocated in Capital Works program for the 2024-2025 financial year. The \$750,000.00 would be spent on the Adventure Playground if Council is successful or reallocated if Council is not.
