

# **Update: Degarra Community Preparedness Session 12 Nov 2025**

## **Degarra Meeting Hub (Project)**

As part of the North Queensland Resilience Program (NQRP) funding, Council has received \$250,000 to 'Construct a Resilience Meeting Hub' in Degarra. The project scope is to plan, design and construct an open-air meeting space for the Degarra community, and explore a small lockable storage container to store Council resources.

Having access to a meeting space will assist with community engagement, awareness raising, and provide a central location for a range of resilience building activities.

Council continues to work with community to find a suitable site location for the construction of the Resilience Meeting Hub.

This project is not funded to construct a place of refuge in the event of a disaster.

#### **Site Options:**

 Continue to assess suitability of existing Council owned and other land options.

#### **Proposed Structure**

A permanent, low maintenance outdoor structure, designed for year-round community use and capable of withstanding local weather conditions.

#### **Key Inclusions (need to be within budget)**

- Steel roof structure with integrated gutters to capture rainwater
- Rainwater tank (tbc litre capacity) for water storage
- Solar lighting
- BBQ unit Power source gas or electric to be confirmed.
- Concrete slab base for durability
- Explore small lockable storage container to store Council resources
- Project Management Fees

\*Size: to be determined based on pricing and available budget







## **Other Projects**

- Council has commenced work with QRA on the Far North Queensland Flood Mitigation Project (FNQFMP).
- Further work will occur on Bloomfield and Woobadda Creek Catchment including bathymetry work (depth across river). The issue of the ballast at the Bloomfield bridge will also be explored.
- Recommendations will be developed from the projects mentioned above, exploring potential mitigation measures.
- A new River Level Gauge has been installed at the Woobadda Bridge.
- LiDAR flood-monitoring technology
  will be installed at the causeway at
  Degarra to work out linkage between
  upstream flooding to downstream FOR
  EARLY WARNING.
- At the session, Weather intelligence expert Chris Nitopoulos (Nitso) from WeatherIQ detailed the events leading up to the flooding associated with Tropical Cyclone Jasper. A second recording provided tools and insights into local weather forecasting.
