RECOMMENDATION

That Council endorses the attendance of the Mayor and Deputy Mayor at the Local Government Association of Queensland (LGAQ) Civic Leaders Summit on 13-15 July 2016 at Benowa, Gold Coast.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The LGAQ Civic Leaders Summit is a unique event for Australian local government and conducted exclusively for Mayors, Deputy Mayors and CEOs with the focus on peer-to-peer fellowship and learning. It provides an opportunity for Queensland's civic leaders to listen to and work with respected figures from politics, government, media, academia and industry over two days.

BACKGROUND

The Civic Leaders Summit is held biennially and 2016 will be the eighth edition of the event. The Summit theme - "*The Winning Team*" - is to encourage focus on the common purpose and synergies that civic leaders require to secure the continued economic and social health of the communities they represent.

The Mayor and Deputy Mayor attended the 2014 event held at the Sunshine Coast at which the Mayor was invited to join a panel discussion. Attached is a copy of the formal invitation the Mayor has recently received from the Chief Executive Officer of the LGAQ to also participate in a panel discussion at the 2016 Summit.

The 2 day program provides for workshops and panel sessions with presenters including the Deputy Premier and Queensland Treasury Corporation, on a variety of topics such as:-

- Delivery Sustainable Productivity and Efficiency in Local Government;
- Better Councils, Better Communities and the Big Three;
- State Expectations of the Class of 2016;
- Promoting Your City or Shire

PROPOSAL

That the Mayor and Deputy Mayor attend the 2016 Civic Leaders Summit in Benowa from 13-15 July 2016, as representatives of the Douglas Shire Council.

FINANCIAL/RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS

The full registration fee per delegate for the Civic Leaders Summit is \$1,375.

Accommodation rates per delegate vary from \$200-\$300 per night depending on venue and availability. Airfares from Cairns to Brisbane also vary in price according to availability and fare flexibility. However initial enquiries estimate return airfares in the vicinity of \$800-\$1000.

Provision for Councillor attendance at conferences is contained within the 2015/16 Budget.
