EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Motions for consideration at the 2017 LGAQ Annual Conference are due by the 25 August. Councillors have put forward their suggested motion, as detailed in Attachment 1, which will be sent to LGAQ for consideration. The suggested motion is; "That the State Government be requested to extend funding for the First 5 Forever public library program beyond 2018 for a further 4 years."

BACKGROUND

The LGAQ Annual Conference allows Queensland councils to come together once a year to debate issues of importance to local communities. Motions give councils a direct say in the LGAQ policy agenda and priorities for local government in Queensland.

COMMENT

The motion to be submitted to the LGAQ Annual Conference will seek support from other Queensland Councils to request the State Government to extend the program funding for the "First 5 Forever" public library program. This program has been running since 2015 and is due for completion in 2018.

This program connects children and families to the information, resources and support they need to bring about positive behavioral change for early language and literacy. Through outreach events public libraries are able to connect to families who are not currently utilising library services, including those perceived to be most vulnerable and from diverse cultural backgrounds.

Over 21,000 "First 5 Forever" sessions took place across the public library network in 2016. These sessions engaged an estimated 452,000 children and their families.

PROPOSAL

That Council sends the attached submission for consideration as a motion at the 2017 LGAQ Annual Conference.

FINANCIAL/RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS

All Queensland Councils are invited to put forward submissions for consideration as motions at the LGAQ Annual Conference and at this point there is no financial implication
