Subordinate Local Law No. 4
(Local Government Controlled Areas,
Facilities and Roads) 2020

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Part 1 Preliminary

1 Short title

This subordinate local law may be cited as Subordinate Local Law No. 4 (Local Government Controlled Areas, Facilities and Roads) 2020.

2 Purpose and how it is to be achieved

- (1) The purpose of this subordinate local law is to supplement Local Law No. 4 (Local Government Controlled Areas, Facilities and Roads) 2020 in order to protect the health and safety of persons using local government controlled land, facilities, infrastructure and roads and preserve features of the natural and built environment and other aspects of the amenity of local government controlled land, facilities, infrastructure and roads.
- (2) The purpose is to be achieved by providing for—
 - (a) the regulation of access to local government controlled areas; and
 - (b) the prohibition or restriction of particular activities in local government controlled areas or roads.

3 Authorising local law

The making of the provisions in this subordinate local law is authorised by *Local Law No .4 (Local Government Controlled Areas, Facilities and Roads) 2020* (the *authorising local law*).

4 Definitions – the dictionary

- (a) The dictionary in schedule 6 defines particular words used in this subordinate local law.
- (b) Other particular words have the same meaning as in the authorising local law.

Part 2 Use of local government controlled areas, facilities and roads

5 Prohibited and restricted activities—authorising local law, s 5(1)

- (1) For section 5(1)(a) of the authorising local law, the activities prescribed in column 2 of schedule 2 are declared to be prohibited in the corresponding local government controlled area or road (or part thereof) mentioned in column 1 of schedule 1.
- (2) For section 5(1)(b) of the authorising local law, the activities prescribed in column 2 of schedule 2 are declared to be restricted in the corresponding local government controlled area or road (or part thereof) mentioned in column 1 of schedule 22, to the extent described in column 3 of schedule 22.

6 Motor vehicle access in local government controlled areas—authorising local law, s 6(1)(b)

For section 6(1)(b) of the authorising local law, the areas prescribed in column 1 of schedule 3 are declared to be motor vehicle access areas.

7 Prohibited vehicles—authorising local law, s 6(3)

For section 6(3) of the authorising local law, the specific types of motor vehicle prescribed in column 2 of schedule 3 are declared to be prohibited vehicles in the corresponding specified motor vehicle access area in column 1 of schedule 33.

8 Opening hours for local government controlled areas and facilities—authorising local law, s 7(1)

For section 7(1) of the authorising local law, the times prescribed in column 2 of schedule 4 are declared to be the opening hours for the local government controlled areas mentioned in column 1 of schedule 4.

9 Permanent closure of local government controlled area—authorising local law, s 8(3)

The local government controlled areas described in schedule 5 are permanently closed to public access.

Part 3 Matters affecting roads

10 Notice requiring owner of land adjoining road to fence land—authorising local law, s 9(3)

For section 9(3) of the authorising local law, the minimum standards for a fence that is the subject of a compliance notice under section 8(2) of the authorising local law are as follows—

- (a) The fence must be, of adequate height, strength and nature and be constructed of appropriate materials for the purpose of restraining the type of animal contained in the area adjacent to the fence.
- (b) Where the fence includes gates or panels which can be readily opened, those gates or panels must be kept closed and latched except when in immediate use by a person entering or leaving the premises on which the animal is kept.

Schedule 6 Dictionary

camp means to occupy or sleep in or to attempt to sleep in a tent or motor vehicle, or otherwise in, on or under a facility, or on the ground and camping has the corresponding meaning.

Cemeteries Register means the Douglas Shire Council Register of Cemeteries.

commercial waste means waste, other than green waste, recyclable waste, interceptor waste or waste discharged to a sewer, produced as a result of the ordinary use or occupation of commercial premises.

domestic waste means waste, other than green waste, recyclable waste, interceptor waste or waste discharged to a sewer, produced as a result of the ordinary use or occupation of a domestic premises.

exercise rights of occupation or use means a person must not unlawfully, do any of the following—

- (a) occupy or live on it; or
- (b) clear, dig up or cultivate it.

facility means any building, structure, car parking area, pedestrian access, vehicle access, fence, picnic shelter, toilet block, playground equipment, park bench, pond, waterfall, fountain, monument, amenities or grounds or any other fixture or fitting and includes an electric power point.

Foreshores Register means the Douglas Shire Council Register of Foreshores.

Libraries Register means the Douglas Shire Council Register of Libraries.

Parks and Reserves Register means the Douglas Shire Council Register of Parks and Reserves.

tent means a structure or erection constructed or covered wholly or in part with canvas, calico or other material and includes a shelter used or capable of being used as a temporary abode or sleeping place.

vehicle see TORUM Act, schedule 6.

TORUM Act means the *Transport Operation Road Use Management Act 1994.*
