

PART 8 OVERLAYS

8.1 **Preliminary**

- (1) Overlays identify areas in the planning scheme that reflect state and local level interests and have one or more of the following characteristics:
 - (a) there is a particular sensitivity to the effects of development;
 - (b) there is a constraint on land use or development outcomes;
 - there is a presence of valuable resources; (c)
 - there are particular opportunities for development. (d)
- (2)Overlays are mapped and included in Schedule 2.
- (3) The changed levels of assessment, if applicable, for development affected by an overlay are in Part 5.
- Some overlays may be included for information purposes only. This should result in no change (4) to the level of assessment or any additional assessment criteria.
- (5) Assessment criteria for an overlay may be contained in one or more of the following:
 - a map for an overlay; (a)
 - (b) a code for an overlay;
 - a zone code; (c)
 - (d) a local plan code;
 - a development code.
- Where development is proposed on premises partly affected by an overlay, the assessment (6)criteria for the overlay only relates to the part of the premises affected by the overlay.
- (7) Each overlay code identifies the following:
 - the application of the code; (a)
 - the purpose of the code; (b)
 - (c) the overall outcomes that achieve the purpose of the code;
 - (d) the performance outcomes of the code;
 - the acceptable outcomes of the code. (e)
- (8)The overlays for the planning scheme are:
 - Acid sulfate soils overlay; (a)
 - (b) Bushfire hazard overlay;
 - (c) Coastal environment overlay:
 - (d) Flood and storm tide hazard overlay;
 - (e) Hillslopes overlay;
 - Landscape values overlay; (f)
 - Natural areas overlay; (g)
 - Places of significance overlay; (h)
 - Potential landslide hazard overlay; (i)
 - (i) Transport network overlay.
