The subject property is located within the Rural Zone under the Local Council planning Scheme. Within this zone, building work is self-assessable development, provided the development meets all the acceptable outcomes of the self-assessable criteria of the relevant Codes. As such, an assessment against the relevant acceptable outcomes has revealed one departure from the acceptable outcomes. Given the departures, the building work is deemed code assessable development requiring compliance with the applicable performance requirements.



 - (ii) Theme 2 – Environment and landscape values: Element 3.5.5 Scenic amenity.
 - (b) enable an assessment of whether development is suitable on land within the Hillslopes sub-categories.
- (2) The purpose of the code will be achieved through the following overall outcomes:
 - (a) development on hillslopes is safe, serviceable and accessible;
 - (b) the ecological values, landscape character and visual quality of the hillslopes are protected from development so as to retain the scenic backdrop to the region;
 - (c) Development on hillslopes is appropriate, having regard to the topographic constraints and environmental characteristics of the land;
 - (d) Development responds to the constraints of the site including gradient and slope stability;
 - (e) Works do not involve complex engineering solutions.




