

The owner has approached Council for planning advice and has been provided with the following information:

- This site has an existing dwelling with building approval and was developed as accepted development under the 1981 Planning Scheme.
- Under the current 2018 Planning Scheme the land is in the *Conservation Zone* and Precinct 1 of the *Cape Tribulation and Daintree Coast Local Plan*.
- The proposed carport is defined as building work and requires a code assessable development permit.
