Hilton will represent GBR race

AFTER beating former Olympian and his idol Steve Moneghetti to the Great Barrier Reef Marathon finish line last year, Jimmy Hilton will take on the role as event ambassador this year.

The Mossman man won the men's event in a time of 3:04:53 - 30m in front of the legendary marathon runner - in Port Douglas.

Hilton was yesterday announced as ambassador for the 2015 Great Barrier Reef Marathon Festival, which will be held on November 1.

He's following in the footsteps of Moneghetti and keen to promote a marathon he says is like no other.

"It's a major honour and a bit overwhelming, to be honest," Hilton said.

"From families to the elite, there's a race for all abilities.

"The marathon incorporates the famous Bump Track, Mowbray National Park, a nasty hill climb and great scenery with a beautiful run up and down Four Mile Beach.

"It's a very tough run and I think that's why people come up for it."

Tour operator Tropical Journeys has come on board as naming rights sponsor for the festival, which raises funds for environmental initiatives.

Organisers donate \$20 from every registration in the 21km, 42.2km and 74km events to the James Cook University Reef research fund, and have set a target of \$20,000.

Participants can also do their own fundraising for this year's projects - eradicating crown-of-thorns starfish and assessing and managing the impact of microplastics on marine animals.

The festival includes six events from a full marathon, half marathon, 10km run, 5km and a 2.5km race.
