#### Introduction

The subject site comprises an area of 1.015 hectares and is located within the Rural Residential Zone under the Douglas Shire Planning Scheme 2018 Version 1.0. The site is further situated within the Wonga Beach Rural Residential Precinct of the Coastal Communities Local Plan.

The proposed development requires 'Code Assessment', as confirmed in accordance with Part 5 – Tables of Assessment.

The following submission provides an assessment of the development proposal against the applicable provisions of the Douglas Shire Planning Scheme 2018 Version 1.0.

A copy of the subdivision plan and a property report is attached.

#### Locality

The site is located at 11 - 17 Bowman Close Wonga Beach and is formally described as Lot 17 on RP744773.

The site is located within the existing established, residential coastal community of Wonga Beach and is located in close proximity to the Wonga Beach State School.

Surrounding development consists of single houses on large allotments with more conventional residential housing located further to the south.

The large allotment to the north is understood to have subdivision approval to create residential allotments of similar sizes to that proposed.

#### **Zoning Designation**

The subject land is included within the Rural Residential Zone, as identified in accordance with Zone Map ZM 008 of the Douglas Shire Planning Scheme.

An extract copy of zoning map is provided below.

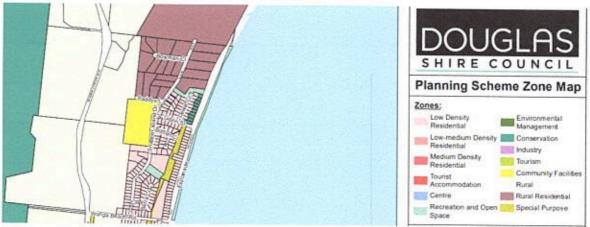
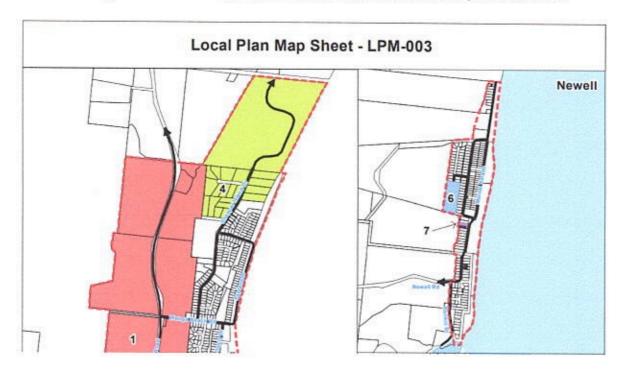


Figure 2 - Zoning Map

#### **Local Plan Designation**

The site is included within the Wonga Beach Rural Residential Precinct of the Coastal Communities Local Plan.

An extract copy of Local Plan mapping showing the various precincts is provided below.



#### Site Features

The site is flat, regularly shaped and has an open drain located in the North West portion of the site. An easement for drainage (Easement B) was established over this drain sometime after the original allotment was created. It is thought that the easement was created around 2004.

The land has significant road frontage to Bowman Close of around 83m. The site contains some mature trees will which be retained as part of the subdivision proposal. There are no other improvements on the land.

As mentioned above, the area of the site is 1.015 hectares and has the ability to be subdivided.

#### Access and Services

Access to the site is provided via Bowman Close being a formed road with grassed verges.

The site is connected to electricity, telecommunications and reticulated water supply. Waste water is treated via onsite treatment and disposal.

#### **Description of Proposed Development**

The plan of subdivision seeks to divide the allotment into 3 allotments with each block having frontage to Bowman Close.

The three lots will range in size from 2013m<sup>2</sup> to 5925m<sup>2</sup> with proposed Lot 1 being the largest allotment located adjacent the existing open drain. Each allotment is appropriately sized and dimensioned to ensure that a house and sheds etc can be accommodated. Proposed Lot 2 having a site area of 2209m2 will be accessed via an access leg. The access leg has a width of 6m.

Each allotment will be individually serviced so there is no requirement for any easements. The existing easement on the land will remain when proposed Lot 1 is created.

Overall, the proposed development represents a residential subdivision that has been designed with consideration to the character of the surrounding Wonga Beach locality and provides for a larger allotment adjacent the existing drain. The proposed lots complement the surrounding residential locality of Wonga Beach and will not impact the privacy, amenity or access arrangements for any of the surrounding lots.

A subdivision plan is attached at Appendix 1.

#### Access

As shown on the proposal plan, each allotment is provided with direct access from Bowman Close. The access for Lot 2 will be constructed as part of the subdivision works due to the allotment being serviced by an access leg. These works will be completed in accordance with Councils Development Manual.

The other access for the allotments can be constructed once the location of a future house has been determined.

#### Services

The site has access to existing reticulated water supply, telecommunication and electricity within the Bowman Close road reserve. The proposed method of waste water disposal is via onsite treatment.

Given the location of the site is within the coastal area and soils are sandy loam, it is requested that the onsite waste water investigations are done as part of investigations for future houses or improvements once they are known. If Council requires this investigation be done as part of the subdivision proposal, it is requested that it only relate to the two smaller allotments being Lot 2 & Lot 3. Ample area exists on Lot 1 for disposal of wastewater onsite which can be determined at a later date.

#### Earthworks

Other than the installation of services and construction of the concrete driveway for Lot 2, no other earthworks are proposed.

Earthworks required for the construction of house pads will be undertaken at the time of constructing a dwelling on each of the allotments.

#### **Local Government Planning**

#### Level of Assessment

The proposed development requires 'Code Assessment', as confirmed in accordance with Part 5 – Tables of Assessment of the Douglas Shire Planning Scheme.

#### **Relevant Codes**

Review of the Douglas Shire Planning Scheme confirms the following Overlays are applicable to the site:

The codes which are triggered by the proposed development are listed as follows:

- Rural Residential Zone Code

- Coastal Communities Local Plan Code
- Acid Sulfate Soils Overlay Code
- Flood Plain and Storm Tide Inundation Overlay Code
- Transport Network (Road Hierarchy) Overlay Code
- Environmental Performance Code
- Excavation and Filling Code
- Infrastructure Works Code
- Landscaping Code
- Reconfiguring a Lot Code

Each of these codes has been reviewed and the following information is provided to assist Council with assessing the proposal.

- The proposed subdivision maintains the rural residential character and amenity of the area. The subdivision of the land has been designed to give due consideration to the open drain located in the North West portion of the allotment. The proposal is consistent with the Rural residential zone code.
- The site is contained within Precinct 4 of the Local Plan which provides an ability to
  create residential allotments with a minimum area of 2000m<sup>2</sup>. The subdivision plan
  is compliant with the outcomes sort for the site under the Local Plan. It is also
  understood that the land to the north will be developed for similar size allotments
  over time. Significant trees are being retained to ensure the character of the area is
  maintained and improve the amenity of the allotments once developed.
- Minimal earthworks are proposed for the site which is limited to the construction of a driveway and installation of services for Lot 2. Earthworks are not of a scale to warrant consideration of the acid sulfate soils code /overlay.
- With the land currently vacant, all three allotments will be developed at a later stage for a Dwelling House by either the land owner or sold on to another party. The site is not affected by storm tide mapping however it is noted that the large allotment to the north of the site is mapped as being affected by storm tide. Storm tide mapping for that site indicates inundation levels at 2.57m AHD with finished floor levels to be 500mm above this to achieve the required immunity i.e 3.07m AHD. The site has existing levels of 4.0m AHD demonstrating that the site is suitably protected from storm tide inundation.

It is noted that the future dwellings will need to comply with the required floor heights. It is also noted that an application will be triggered for these allotments when a house is to be constructed. It is a more logical and practical approach to defer earthworks until this is known.

- Reticulated water supply is available in Bowman Close. Each of the allotments has
  the ability to connect to Council's network. A conduit for water supply will be
  installed in the access leg for Lot 2 as part of the subdivision works.
- Existing vegetation / landscaping is being retained on site. It is acknowledged that some of the vegetation maybe removed when the properties are developed for a house. However, this will be at the choice and discretion of future owners and Council if assessing applications for a house.

#### Summary

This application seeks approval to subdivide land at 11 - 17 Bowman Close at Wonga Beach into 3 allotments. The development is illustrated on the subdivision plan as attached.

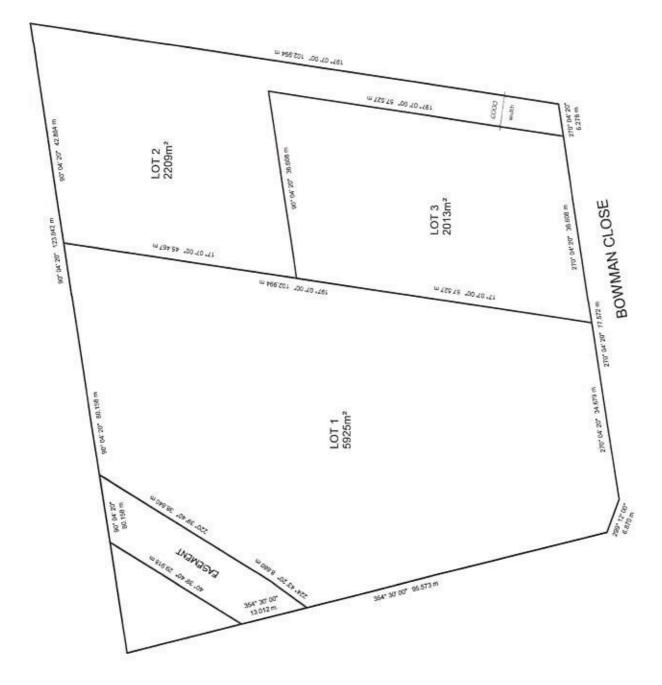
Grounds in support of this application are as follows:
